Approved Activities

The following list of approved activities suggests types of activities from which students may choose. Other activities of a similar nature may be approved by the Principal. Remember, to qualify, the activity must be <u>unpaid</u> and <u>completed outside of regular school hours</u>. Activities not identified on this list of approved activities must be approved by the Principal or designate before starting the activity. If completed without permission and permission is subsequently denied, the activity or event will not be counted toward the student's community involvement requirement.

volunteer activity in reception, computer work and mailings for individuals or groups providing charitable or general community benefit

As stated in *Ontario Secondary Schools, Grades 9 to 12: Program and Diploma Requirements, 1999* (OSS), every student who begins secondary school during or after the 1999–2000 school year must complete a minimum of 40 hours of community involvement activities as part of the requirements for an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). The purpose of the community involvement requirement is to encourage students to develop awareness and understanding of civic responsibility and of the role they can play and the contributions they can make in supporting and strengthening their communities.

Procedures for Students:

Students may complete the 40 hours of community involvement activities at any time during their secondary school program (including the summer before they enter Grade 9). Students under the age of eighteen years will plan and select their community involvement activities in consultation with their parents. The activities chosen should fall with the list of eligible activities (see back of this form). If the activity is not on the list of eligible activities, the activity must be approved by the Principal before starting the activity.

Fully complete the Community Involvement Activities Form and obtain all necessary signatures. When complete, turn the form into the Records Office.
