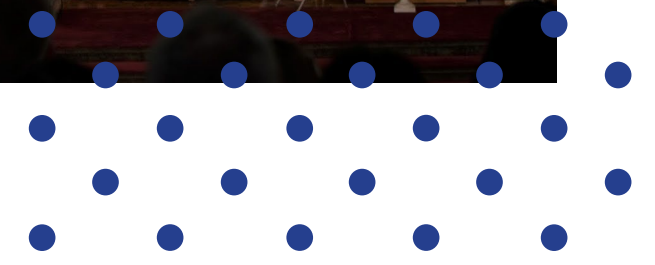

ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR

Beverly (Blackwell) Reeves

Beverly (Blackwell) Reeves was born in Cobden, Ontario to parents who loved to serve their Lord Jesus Christ and their community and believed strongly in Christian Education. Their five Children attended Oshawa Missionary College during the 1950's and 1960's. The Children fondly remember the gift of hospitality in their family home, which was described by many as "The Blackwell Hotel"; no one was a stranger. Beverly is the youngest of the five siblings and graduated from Oshawa Missionary College in 1963 and 1965. Beverly and her husband, Dr. David Reeves '55, enjoy retirement travelling and relaxing at their home in Banning, California.



In May 2003, Beverly established a Kingsway College student scholarship in honour of her dedicated parents Sam & Violet Blackwell that bears their name "Sam & Violet Blackwell Memorial Scholarship".



In the mid 1980's, OMC Alumnus, Wilfred Hillock, suggested starting a Kingsway College (OMC) California Alumni Chapter in the Loma Linda area. July 12, 1986, marked a first Kingsway Alumni Association as a Regional Alumni Chapter and was organized at Redlands, California. It was gratifying to have seventy-nine in attendance at the first meeting held at Griswold's Restaurant in Redlands. Ralph and Connie Janes and Carolyn and Aubrey Osmond attended the first meeting representing the school.

Among the group were Mr. and Mrs. T.K. Martin. Mr. Martin was the oldest graduate having graduated with the class of 1920 along with Mrs. H.M.S. Richards. Elections were held and the officers of the new chapter were President- Wilfred Hillock, Vice-President-Donovan Shepard, Secretary – Linda Banks, Treasurer-Jeanene Embleton Buchanan, **Address Secretary – Beverly Blackwell Reeves** and Kingsway Contact Correspondent – Ruby Hey Hillock.

Beverly has been the leader or active assistant with the KC California Chapter for the past thirty-two years. Beverly has been involved in, and has worked tirelessly in every California Chapter meeting since that first meeting in 1986 and is a true example of Kingsway's motto of "Service Not Fame".

The Alumni Association had hoped that Beverly and David could be with us for this 2018 Alumni weekend; however, a previous engagement prevented them both from attending. Beverly was awarded the Alumnus of the year plaque on February 24, 2018 at the California Alumni Chapter meeting in Loma Linda.

HONOURARY ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR

Pierre Chartier



Pierre Chartier was selected as 2018 Kingsway Honourary Alumnus-of-the-Year for many reasons. The Kingsway College Aerials would not have begun in 1983 without his time, energy, and dedication to youth. This entertaining and fitness-based, new acro team, with human pyramids, gymnastic routines, lights and music was based on his inspiring experiences in the Gymnics while an Andrews University student, with enthusiasm and techniques developed in an earlier acrobatic team at the Séminaire Adventiste du Salève in 1982.

Pierre was excited to found the Aerials when he returned to live in his wife's Canadian homeland the following year, but it took some perseverance and a few meetings to convince the Administration that Pierre was up for the challenge, because he was not yet a teacher at Kingsway, barely spoke English, and looked even younger than he was, still wearing braces on his shy smile. However, very quickly,

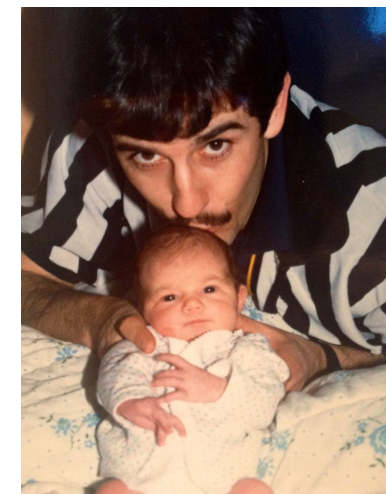
Pierre's decency, courtesy, and focus on safety and teamwork helped to lay the foundations for a team which would go on to mean a great deal to over one thousand students over the years.

"Pierre was kinetically gifted, spatially-brilliant, and endlessly creative", his wife, Devon, remembers. "I would wake up almost every morning to piles of sketches of acrobatic formations on the kitchen table." Many also enjoyed Pierre's gift for storylines, colourful uniforms and costumes for different routines, and his sense of humour.

Over the twelve years that he helped coach the club, Pierre also revealed a penchant for organizing trips, taking the team from Newfoundland to the Western Provinces, Minnesota, and many other places, including a tour of France and Switzerland with 40 acrobats from Canadian University College, Andrews, and Kingsway in 1987. Everywhere they went, people, especially other youth, saw that sports, young people supporting each other, and other healthy goals could make life better. The Aerials are now coached by Jason Wilkins.

Pierre also instructed French and Phys. Ed at Kingsway College until 1995. Since his time at Kingsway, Pierre has taught French immersion courses at Southwood Park P.S. in Ajax (with time to run an elementary acrobatic team as well, of course!), volunteered to coach "The Eastdale Acrobats" at that Oshawa high school with his wife between 1984-1987, coached a downhill ski racing team, cross-country teams, and track & field athletes at Whitby's Sinclair Secondary School for twenty years. He also loves running and cycling, taking cyclists to Europe sixteen times with his brother-in-law, John Connors. As a French and physical education teacher, Pierre planned and guided a total of forty sports and language tours for Kingsway and other students around the Durham District School Board.

Without a doubt, Pierre Chartier's passion for life, deep sense of caring and nurturing of children and young adults, and his desire to share the joys of fitness and travel have made life healthier and more joyful for countless students and their families. Thank you, Pierre, and congratulations on your well-deserved selection as Kingsway Honourary Alumnus-of-the-Year 2018.

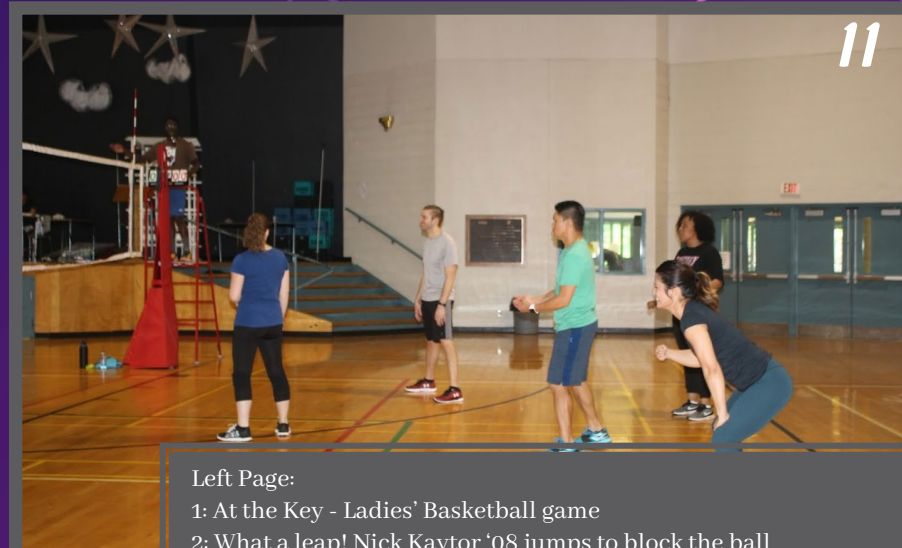

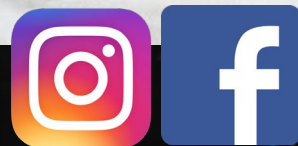

Leona Ruth Alderson Brooks 1930 - 2018

Leona was born on June 4, 1930 in Bosanquet Township, Ontario. This township is in western Ontario near London. Leona was the oldest of three children. She attended a one room school house where she completed grades one to eight. She completed high school in Forest, Ontario. She was baptized into the Adventist Church November 1, 1947. It is interesting to note that few of us remember the date of our own baptism.

In 1948 she came to Oshawa Missionary College where she completed grade 13. This was not the provincial grade 13 but actually the first year of college. This equipped students to attend a S.D.A. college in the United States such as Andrews University. (Known as Emmanuel Missionary College in those days.)

From the time she was a small child she wanted to be a teacher and never changed her mind. During 1949-1950 she attended "Normal School". In those days Normal School was the name given to schools dedicated to preparing students to teach elementary school.

She taught at McGilvory Township Public School from 1950 to 1951. She then took a job at the Paris church school where she remained until 1962 except for one year at the Hamilton church school. Apparently she was transferred to Hamilton because they thought she could handle some difficult students. She remembers that year as the most difficult year of her career. At the end of that year the good people of Paris asked the conference to bring her back to Paris.

In 1962 she took a job at OMC

teaching grades three and four. (In 1963 OMC became Kingsway College.) During her time with K. C. (29 years) she taught a variety of family studies courses including home economics, Marriage and Family plus guidance and an important course called bachelor survival! During her 41 years of teaching, she had one sick day (doctor's order) as a skateboard ran into her ankle.

Apparently around 1972 the board felt that family studies should be discontinued. When the students found out about this they started a petition to keep her on. We have this petition here today and there are at least 75 names on it. Most of the signatures are accompanied by passionate appeals for her continued employment. Some of them were more passionate than others: For example: "The girl that I marry, God willing, will most definitely have to be a graduate of a Home Ec. Class. You're robbing me of a future wife!"

Leona continued to work on her own education and received a Bachelor's degree from AUC in 1964 and a Master's degree in 1969 from Andrew's University where she graduated summa cum laude; one of only six. She also completed work at the Faculty of Education, University of Toronto to receive a certificate in family studies teaching.

Leona retired in June, 1991. She knew of four of her students who became registered dietitians. Before she retired she had been teaching cooking classes and nutrition classes and this continued afterward. She held classes in many church basements in Ontario as well as Montreal, Cuba and Bulgaria. She also published two cook books: Healthy Food Choices books 1 (1994) and 2 (2000). She was one of two women who became the first female elders at College Park Church. She served College Park Church as elder, board member and several other positions.

One winter day Greg Bussey,



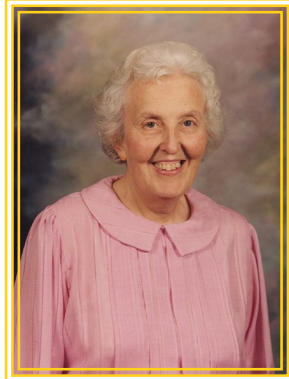
when walking by Faculty homes noticed Leona shoveling snow. "Ms. Alderson you shouldn't have to be shoveling snow." He continued shoveling the rest of the winter. When he became a faculty member he would tease Leona about finding her a husband. One day she called him saying that he had done a poor job of finding a husband for her and that she had found one herself! Greg thought she was joking, but sure enough, it was Jim Brooks. They were married August 10, 2003. She was 73, Jim was 80. They were married almost 13 years. It was this news that traveled around the continent. In 2007, Leona received the

Alumnus of the year award and Jim received the Honorary Alumnus of the year. On KC campus he was known as Mr. Cement Man.

This life sketch is not about Jim except that it is about Jim because they made a wonderful pair. They traveled together. He helped her with her cooking classes and CHIP programs. The enduring memory I have of them is walking arm in arm to church from Pioneer Apartments and sitting on the left hand side towards the front. They were always at church on Sabbath and for any other service that was being held. They were loyal. When asked about the accolades she had been given she said: "Well I don't clamour for it, but I'll accept the responsibility handed to me." She was a real role model. She truly lived Kingsway's motto, "Service not Fame".

She was predeceased by her brother Bruce and her sister Mabel. She is survived by her sister-in-law: Joyce Alderson, three nephews: Adam, Alan, Wayne and three grand nieces and nephews.

Rest in peace Leona. We will see you in the morning.



In Memoriam

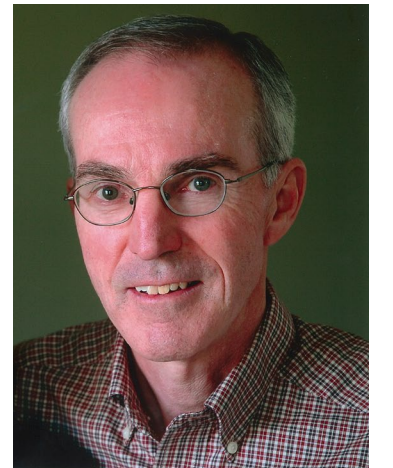
Barbara Anita Butters 1949-2018

Wayne was born in Oshawa, ON in 1948 living close to the church school on OMC campus for grades 1-8, OMC and KC for grades 9-12, graduating in 1966 from KC. He graduated from AUC in 1970 and worked as a medical technologist in the microbiology lab of an almost 1000 bed hospital. He was married to Nelda for 33 happy years and their son Carson was one of the major joys in their life. They lived near Huntsville, Alabama on 3 acres with a small house which they spent a lot of time and energy remodeling and adding on. He enjoyed gardening - fruit crops of blueberries, figs, and Japanese persimmons. Digital photography was his main hobby - printed his photos, matted, framed and sold a few. His pictures were a permanent display in the hospital that he worked



Bud (Malcolm) Day 1949-2018

Bud (Malcolm) Day was born March 23, 1949 and moved to Courtice, Ontario from Quebec when he was 5. He attended the Elementary School on OMC campus for grades 1-8 and KC (1964-1966) for grades 9 and 10. He had a son, Robby, and was a truck driver. He passed away January 4, 2018 at the age of 68.
