



# Are you eligible for College/University entrance?

It is **YOUR** responsibility to ensure that:

- 1. You have requirements to graduate
- 2. You have the pre-requisites for the programs you are applying for



# Are you eligible for College/University entrance?

- It is your responsibility as a student to research the minimum mark and prerequisite requirements for each program you apply for.
- It is your responsibility as a student to be in regular consultation with your teachers during formative assessments to find out what you have to do to attain the required averages for your summative assessments.



## **Ontario Scholar**

- A student may be designated an Ontario Scholar if he or she satisfies both of the following requirements:
  - ✓ Obtains an aggregate of at least 480 marks in any combination of ministry-approved courses providing a total of six credits
  - ✓ Recommended by the school principal for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- ✓ Ministry-approved courses
  - ✓ any Grade 12 university preparation, university/college preparation, college preparation, workplace preparation, and/or open courses authorized under OSS, including locally developed courses approved by the ministry
- ✓ What if you have more than 6 courses?
  - ✓ The highest 6 grades will be used



# Non-Academic Grad Requirements

- ✓ Community Hours Need 40 hours
- ✓ Ontario Literacy
  - ✓ Either:
    - ✓ Have passed the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test or
    - ✓ Complete Ontario Literacy Course 2<sup>nd</sup>

      Semester



### **Full Disclosure**

- All grade 11 & 12 courses you attempt will appear on your transcript whether or not you pass them.
- The full disclosure date for Semester 1 is Nov. 26, 2018 and for Semester 2 is May 29, 2019. Please note that OCAS and OUAC transmission dates are prior to both full disclosure dates. More information will follow in November and in April regarding course drop procedures to meet full disclosure deadlines.
- Be sure to ask about the full disclosure date at any other school you may be taking courses from, if you plan to drop a course and avoid full disclosure.



## **Transcripts**

- Ontario universities and colleges will receive your information electronically so you should not need a transcript.
- If an unofficial transcript is all that is needed it is free. Most Adventist universities (except Oakwood) will accept an unofficial copy until the final transcript is ready.
- Be sure to ask about the full disclosure date at any other school you may be taking courses from, if you plan to drop a course and avoid full disclosure.



## **Ontario College Requirements**

For Diploma Programs at Ontario Colleges

- ENG4C or ENG4U
- Some programs require pre-requisite courses
- Some programs have a minimum average or minimum % for certain courses



## **Ontario University Requirements**

For Degree Programs at Ontario Colleges and Ontario Universities

- ENG4U
- 5 other grade 12U or 12M courses (no more than two 12M courses)
  - Most colleges/universities include prerequisites courses in the admission average
  - Some programs have a minimum average or minimum % for certain courses













































#### **Application Fees for College**

- \$95.00 for application to 5 programs. No more that 3 programs at 1 college.
- All fees are non-refundable. Cash can NOT be sent through the mail.
   Credit Card payments are preferred.
- Applications <u>will not</u> be forwarded to colleges until full payment has been received by OCAS. Partial payments will not be processed.
- · Payment must be in Canadian funds.



#### **Out of Province Applications**

Applications for out-of-province schools can be found at individual web-sites. Be aware that deadlines may differ from Ontario schools.

- OUAC assists the following out-of-province institutions in collecting academic data for Ontario secondary students who have applied through the OUAC:

- Apply first to OUAC, then using your OUAC reference #, submit your application(s) out of province, quoting this number.



#### **Application Fees for University**

- \$150.00 for application to 3 programs. \$50.00 for each additional choice. \*Remember to consider alternate offers of admission.
- All fees are non-refundable. Cash can NOT be sent through the mail.
   Credit card payments are preferable.
- Applications will not be forwarded to universities until full payment has been received by OUAC. Partial payments will not be processed.
- · Payment must be in Canadian funds.



#### Applying outside of Ontario

- You are responsible for downloading and submitting the applications
- Check deadlines and pre-requisites; they will vary from those in Ontario.



## **Applying to the United States**


- It is your responsibility to understand the application for the institute you want to apply for (most places use The Common Application form and the first submission deadline is usually Nov 1<sup>st</sup>).
- ACT or SAT exam may be required.



















































- □Register for an online account with the universities that you applied to (will get status updates, additional information, etc.)





Making Changes or Responding to Offer of Admission...


Check out the "HOW TO" videos on OUAC's website which clearly explain how to:



























































































#### **Student Contribution**

#### What you pay out of pocket

You are expected to contribute \$3,000 per school year to your education costs.

This amount is based on the amount a student can earn (after tax) while working over a summer. By working an average of 17 hours per week – at minimum wage, for 16 weeks – you will be able to make this contribution.

You can also put any existing <u>savings</u> toward the required contribution amount. Or, if you are working at a <u>part-time job</u> while in school, you can put the money you earn during the school year towards the contribution amount.






## **Student Line of Credit**


- Student line of credit vs. parent's line of credit

- Back up plan






