- Post-secondary research *before* finalizing university application
- Visit University/College Campuses
- Meet all deadlines and read all correspondence
- Check application status with OUAC or Universities
- Ensure documents & non-academic requirements received by university (any grades for courses taken outside of day school, TOEFL results etc.)

- Discuss paying for university with family (ie, parents, caregivers, etc.)

Are you eligible for College/University entrance?

It is **YOUR** responsibility to ensure that:

1. You have requirements to graduate
2. You have the pre-requisites for the programs you are applying for



Are you eligible for College/University entrance?

- It is your responsibility as a student to research the minimum mark and prerequisite requirements for each program you apply for.
- It is your responsibility as a student to be in regular consultation with your teachers during formative assessments to find out what you have to do to attain the required averages for your summative assessments.



Non-Academic Grad Requirements

- ✓ Community Hours – Need 40 hours
- ✓ Ontario Literacy
 - ✓ Either:
 - ✓ Have passed the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test or
 - ✓ Complete Ontario Literacy Course by end of 2nd Semester



Ontario Scholar

- ✓ A student may be designated an Ontario Scholar if he or she satisfies *both* of the following requirements:
 - ✓ Obtains an aggregate of at least 480 marks in any combination of ministry-approved courses providing a total of six credits
 - ✓ Recommended by the school principal for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- ✓ Ministry-approved courses
 - ✓ any Grade 12 university preparation, university/college preparation, college preparation, workplace preparation, and/or open courses authorized under OSS, including locally developed courses approved by the ministry
- ✓ What if you have more than 6 courses?
 - ✓ The highest 6 grades will be used



Full Disclosure

- All grade 11 & 12 courses you attempt will appear on your transcript whether or not you pass them.
- The full disclosure date for **Semester 1 is Nov. 28, 2022 and for Semester 2 is May 1, 2023**. **Please note that OCAS and OUAC transmission dates are prior to both full disclosure dates. More information will follow in November and in April regarding course drop procedures to meet full disclosure deadlines.**
- Be sure to ask about the full disclosure date at any other school you may be taking courses from if you plan to drop a course and avoid full disclosure.
- Remember, if it is an online course it is not a date, but rather when you complete more than 50% of the course that full disclosure kicks in.



Transcripts

- Ontario universities and colleges will receive your information electronically, so you should not need a transcript.
- If an unofficial transcript is all that is needed it is free. Most Adventist universities (except Oakwood) will accept an unofficial copy until the final transcript is ready.



Ontario University Requirements

- Most colleges/universities include pre-requisites courses in the admission average
- Some programs have a minimum average or minimum % for certain courses

- Some programs require pre-requisite courses



 Basic Requirements for Admission

The primary criterion for admission to OCAD University's studio based degree programs (BDes or BFA) is a portfolio assessment. All applicants will be scheduled for a portfolio assessment. Admission to our non-studio degree program (BA Honours) is based on a combination of academic requirements and supplemental application materials. A \$40 fee, payable in advance, is required to cover the cost of the portfolio reviews and/or supplemental application materials.

All offers of admission are conditional upon meeting the minimum academic requirements. Ontario high school students must successfully complete an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), including the following:

- Six 4U/M courses with an overall final average of 70%
- 4U English (ENG4U) with a minimum final grade of 70%

If English is not your native language and you have not completed four full years of study in an English school system, you will be required to provide additional documentation of English proficiency. Failed and Repeated Courses

If a course has been taken more than once, the highest reported successful grade will be considered.

Certificate Programs

Certificate programs require the completion of two semesters (or one year) of study, as approved by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities.

Diploma Programs

Regular diploma programs require the completion of at least four semesters (or two years) of study, as approved by the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities. An advanced diploma is granted after six semesters (three years) of study.

What you need to know before you apply

- OEN (Ontario Education Number) (found on your report card)
- Your temporary PIN
- Ensure you have all the requirements needed for the program that you will be applying for.
- Ensure you meet ALL deadlines from OUAC/ universities.

Application Fees for College

- **\$110.00** for application to **5 programs**. No more that 3 programs at 1 college.
- All fees are non-refundable. Cash can **NOT** be sent through the mail. Credit Card payments are preferred.
- Applications **will not** be forwarded to colleges until full payment has been received by **OCAS**. Partial payments will not be processed.
- Payment must be in Canadian funds.



Application Fees for University

All fees are non-refundable. We will not forward your application to any universities until you submit full payment to the OUAC. We will not refund fees for withdrawn university choices.

Reminder: There may be **additional fees** if you change your program choices after you have paid.

All fees are listed in Canadian dollars.

Fees

1. Base Application Fee: \$150

- For your initial 3 program choices.
- Required of all applicants.

2. Additional Choice Fee: \$50/choice

- For each additional program choice beyond your first 3 (e.g., if you add 2 additional university choices, you must pay \$100 in addition to the base application fee).
- **Notes:**
 - There is no fee for replacing a program choice with another program choice at the same university.
 - If you amend your application to withdraw a program choice at 1 university and add a program choice at a different university, you will be charged \$50 for the new program choice.
 - You may apply to as many Ontario universities as you wish; however, you are limited to a maximum of 3 program choices at any 1 university (including its affiliates). Some universities may further limit the number of programs you can apply to.

3. International Service Fee: \$10

- If you are not a Canadian citizen or permanent resident (landed immigrant).

4. Supplemental Program Fee

- Supplemental program fees cover the cost of individual faculty admission processes. The supplemental program fee is non-refundable and you pay it along with your OUAC application fee.

- Check deadlines and pre-requisites; they will vary from those in Ontario.



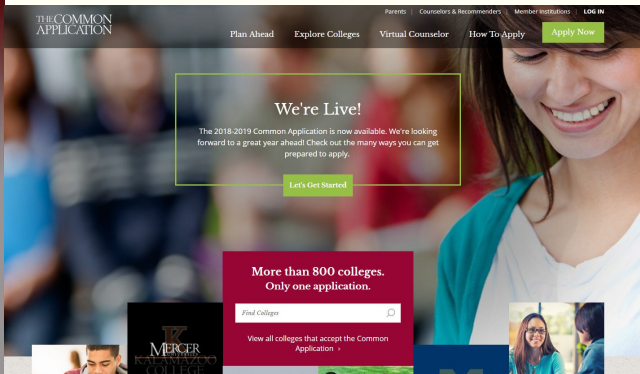
Applying to the United States

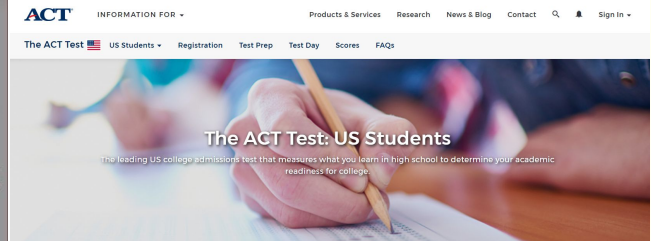

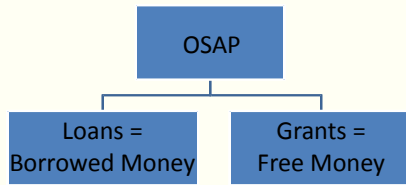

The Government Piece: What is OSAP?

- The Ontario Student Assistance Program is a needs based loan and grant program, funded by both the federal and provincial government, which provides financial assistance to students to help them attend college or university.
- "Its purpose is to supplement, not to replace, the financial resources that you (and your family, if applicable) are expected to contribute."
- Through **one** application (per academic year), you will be considered for non- repayable grants, as well as loans.



Why should you apply for OSAP?

OSAP: Ontario Student Assistance Program

You can get grants and loans to help you pay for university or college when you qualify for OSAP.



The OSAP Loan is an interest free loan as long as you are attending a post secondary institution full time (60% or greater)

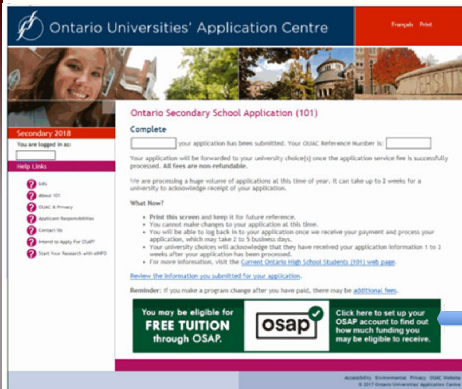
Federal Interest Rate = Prime + 2.5

Provincial Interest Rate = Prime + 1.0

OSAP offers a grace period. OSAP loans are payment free for the first six months after you graduate. **The Ontario portion of OSAP loans are no longer interest free for six months after you graduate.**

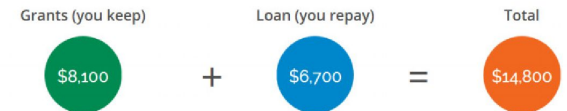

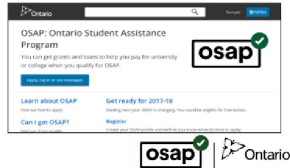

- 6 Print, sign and submit your MSFAA to a designated Canada Post office.
The Master Student Financial Assistance Agreement (MSFAA) is your lifetime loan agreement.

Student Contribution

What you pay out of pocket

You are currently expected to contribute \$3,600 per school year to your education costs.

This amount is based on the amount a student can earn (after tax) while working over a summer. By working an average of 17 hours per week - at minimum wage, for 16 weeks - you will be able to make this contribution.

You can also put any existing savings toward the required contribution amount. Or, if you are working at a part-time job while in school, you can put the money you earn during the school year towards the contribution amount.

May 1, 2023: Confirmation Deadline

Most offers of admission must be confirmed by this date. The colleges will determine the due date to confirm offers made after May 1. Check your offer package to find out the expiry date of your offer of admission.

June 2023: Tuition Deposit Due
