Are you eligible for College/University entrance?

It is **YOUR** responsibility to ensure that:

- 1. You have requirements to graduate
- 2. You have the pre-requisites for the programs you are applying for



Are you eligible for College/University entrance?

- It is your responsibility as a student to research the minimum mark and prerequisite requirements for each program you apply for.
- It is your responsibility as a student to be in regular consultation with your teachers during formative assessments to find out what you have to do to attain the required averages for your summative assessments.



Non-Academic Grad Requirements

- ✓ Community Hours Need 40 hours
- Ontario Literacy
 - ✓ Either:
 - ✓ Have passed the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test or
 - ✓ Complete Ontario Literacy Course by end of 2nd Semester



New Grad Requirement

- ✓ Online Learning Credits (2)
 - One credit can be granted from courses taken during pandemic closure
 - ✓ Any course taken through ILC or a similar online program
 - Parents can approve student to opt out



Ontario Scholar

- ✓ A student may be designated an Ontario Scholar if he or she satisfies both of the following requirements:
 - ✓ Obtains an aggregate of at least 480 marks in any combination of ministry-approved courses providing a total of six credits
 - Recommended by the school principal for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- Ministry-approved courses
 - ✓ any Grade 12 university preparation, university/college preparation, college preparation, workplace preparation, and/or open courses authorized under OSS, including locally developed courses approved by the ministry
- ✓ What if you have more than 6 courses?
 - ✓ The highest 6 grades will be used



Full Disclosure

- All grade 11 & 12 courses you attempt will appear on your transcript whether or not you pass them.
- The full disclosure date for Semester 1 is Nov. 22, 2023 and for Semester 2 is May 1, 2023. Please note that OCAS and OUAC transmission dates are prior to both full disclosure dates. More information will follow in November and in April regarding course drop procedures to meet full disclosure deadlines.
- Be sure to ask about the full disclosure date at any other school you may be taking courses from if you plan to drop a course and avoid full disclosure.
- Remember, if it is an online course it is not a date, but rather when you complete more than 50% of the course that full disclosure kicks in.



Transcripts

- Ontario universities and colleges will receive your information electronically, so you should not need a transcript.
- If an unofficial transcript is all that is needed it is free. Most Adventist universities (except Oakwood) will accept an unofficial copy until the final transcript is ready.

Certificate Programs

Application Fees for College

- \$110.00 for application to 5 programs. No more that 3 programs at 1 college.
- All fees are non-refundable. Cash can NOT be sent through the mail.
 Credit Card payments are preferred.
- Applications <u>will not</u> be forwarded to colleges until full payment has been received by OCAS. Partial payments will not be processed.
- · Payment must be in Canadian funds.

4. Supplemental Program Fee


Applying to the United States

The Government Piece: What is OSAP?

- The Ontario Student Assistance Program is a needs based loan and grant program, funded by both the federal and provincial government, which provides financial assistance to students to help them attend college or university.
- "Its purpose is to <u>supplement</u>, not to replace, the financial resources that you (and your family, if applicable) are expected to contribute."
- Through one application (per academic year), you will be considered for non-repayable grants, as well as loans.





Why should you apply for OSAP?

OSAP: Ontario Student Assistance Program

You can get grants and loans to help you pay for university or college when you qualify for OSAP.



The OSAP Loan is an <u>interest free loan</u> as long as you are attending a post secondary institution full time (60% or greater)


Federal Interest Rate = Prime + 2.5

Provincial Interest Rate = Prime + 1.0


OSAP offers a grace period. OSAP loans are payment free for the first six months after you graduate. The Ontario portion of OSAP loans are no longer interest free for six months after you graduate.





Print, sign and submit your MSFAA to a designated Canada Post office.

The Master Student Financial Assistance Agreement (MSFAA) is your lifetime loan agreement.

Track the status of your application online, and learn how much money you'll get and when. You can even do this from your phone!

Student Contribution

What you pay out of pocket

You are currently expected to contribute \$3,600 per school year to your education costs.

This amount is based on the amount a student can earn (after tax) while working over a summer. By working an average of 17 hours per week – at minimum wage, for 16 weeks – you will be able to make this contribution.

You can also put any existing <u>savings</u> toward the required contribution amount. Or, if you are working at a <u>part-time job</u> while in school, you can put the money you earn during the school year towards the contribution amount.

Important Dates - OUAC

- October/November 2023: Access codes are provided for the 101 Application.
- January 15, 2024: Deadline to submit your completed application to the OUAC.
- May 29, 2024: Last day you can expect a response from an Ontario university if you applied by the January 15 deadline. (Offer of admission, refusal or deferral)
- June 3, 2024: The earliest day you may be required to respond to an offer and give a financial commitment (e.g., registration or residence deposit, etc.).

Important Dates - OCAS

October 2023: Online Application Opens

2022/2023 application opens on ontariocolleges.ca

November 1, 2023: Earliest Offer Date

This is the earliest date that colleges may begin to send offers of admission to programs for the upcoming academic year. Offers will continue to be issued until programs are filled or wait-lists are established.

February 1, 2024: Equal Consideration Date

Applications received and paid for on or before this date are considered equally by the colleges. It is critical to apply to highly competitive programs by this date. Applications are still processed after this date, but are considered on a first-come, first-served basis by the colleges.

May 1, 2024: Confirmation Deadline

Most offers of admission must be confirmed by this date. The colleges will determine the due date to confirm offers made after May 1. Check your offer package to find out the expiry date of your offer of admission.

June 2024: Tuition Deposit Due

The colleges require payment of a tuition deposit in June to secure your spot in your program. Each college sets its own tuition deposit amount and payment deadline. This information will be communicated to you by the college.
