Online copies of Cedar Sentinel are available on the Kingsway website (kingsway.college) if ever you are unable to retrieve a physical paper copy.



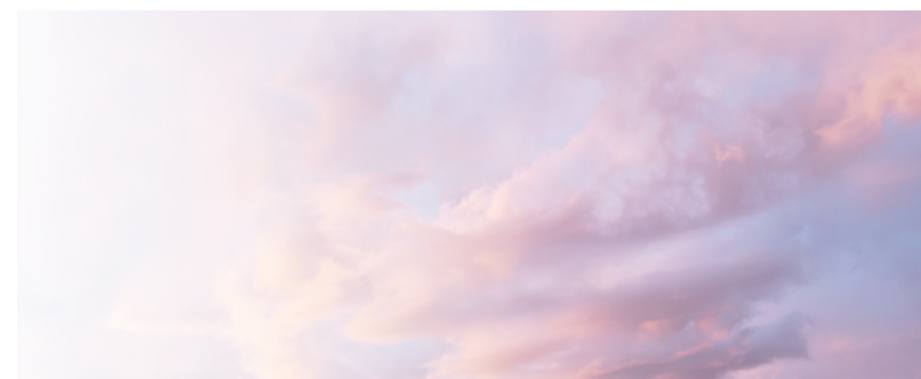

Once again, be strong and courageous, for the Lord will be with you wherever you go.

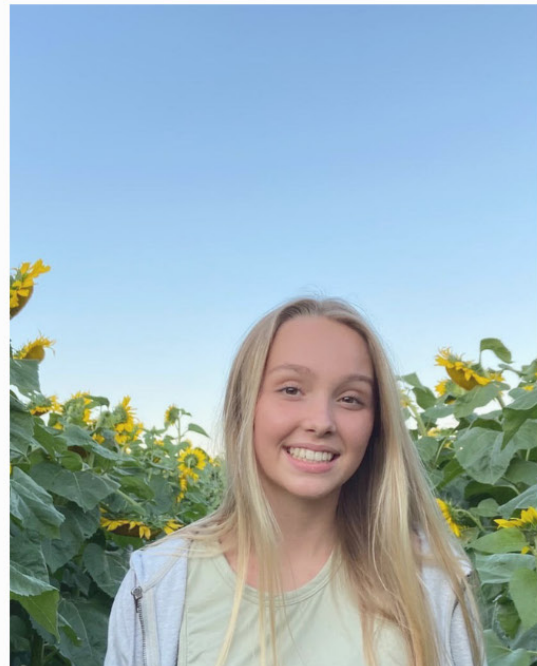

Communications Minister

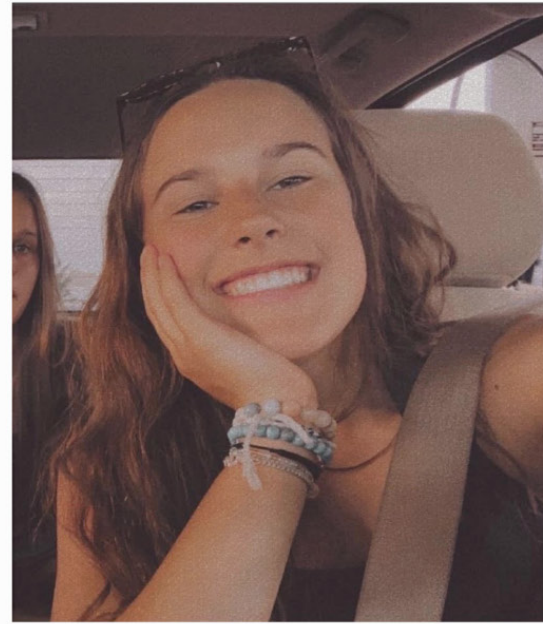

Service & Outreach Minister

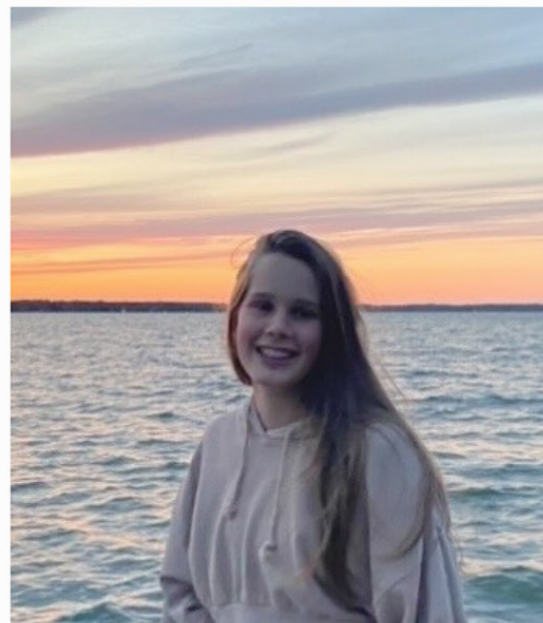
Hi! My name is Hilary Michelle, and I am your Service and Outreach Minister. I am a senior here at Kingsway. I wish you an amazing school year!

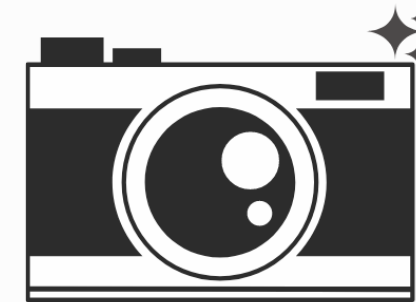
LYELLE BALAN AND ESTHER MARTIN

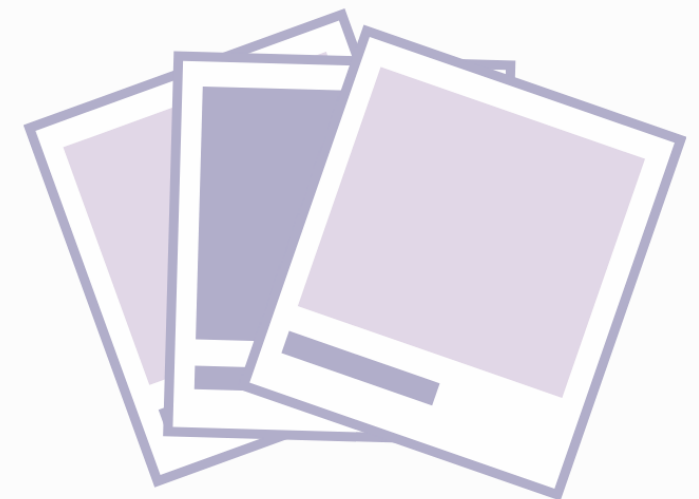
LYELLE BALAN

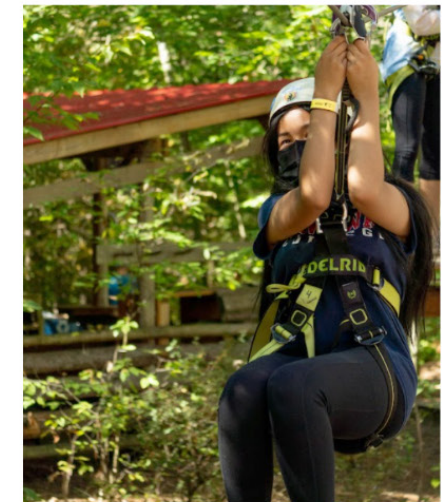

When her and her grandmother went shopping in town, Phyllis saw a bright orange shirt, which her grandmother bought for her. On her first day of school, she put on the orange shirt her grandmother bought her.

When she arrived at St. Joseph's Residential School in Williams Lake, BC, her orange shirt was stripped away from her. Her long hair was cut, and the residential schools attempted to strip Phyllis' culture away from her.

Orange Day is a day where we can all mourn the hardships which the Indigenous peoples of Canada went through not only in residential schools, but through the colonization of Canada in general. Orange Day is also a day where we can celebrate and remember the culture of the Indigenous people of Canada.
